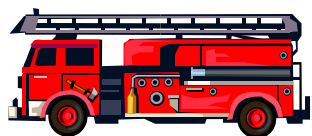

Be safe out there.

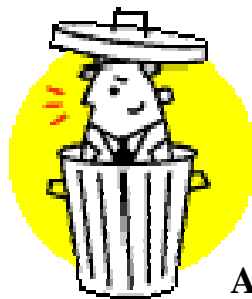
